ORIGINS OF THE TRUST.

A group of concerned parishioners and conservationists got together in September 1982. Following that date they remained in existance monitoring, at a low level, matters which might affect the quality of life in the Parish. This naturally came to a head with the large scale development proposed at Higher Farm. This catalysed these people into forming the Thorncombe Village Trust as a more active public body. Documents relating to earlier trust activities are available on file. The name Thorncombe Village Trust was formally adopted on Wednesday 14 May 1986.

HISTORICAL.

We already have a complete transcript of the 1841 census and half of the 1851 census, which still remains to be completed. Tithe maps need to be copied and old field names preserved. It is an endless task but so rewarding. Last but not least research into the personal history of Thorncombe's population and the famous sons and daughters of yesteryear. FOOTPATHS AND BRIDLEWAYS.

This group will endeavour to establish, with the aid of the Ordenance Survey maps, the position of all footpaths and bridlepaths in the Parish of Thorncombe. Together with those which continue beyond the Parish boundary to the County road. It is hoped to produce 2 booklets, one on footpaths and one on bridleways, which will contain a map and text listing starting points, direction, destination and points of interest along the way. A start will be made on the well established reguarly used routes with easy access, suitable for all age groups and later the more difficult and overgrown paths that are less well defined will be tackled. This will be carried out in consultation with the Parish Council Footpaths/Bridleways Liaison Officer, Mr Mark Roper and the County Officer with the co-operation of the land owners and occupiers. LITTER AND RECYCLING.

We are collecting all information from the Council and Blue Van to see what services are available beyond the dustbin collection. We understand that a number of Planning Applications have now been lodged with the W.D.D.C. These are 1) Higher Farm, 2) Jay's, Chard Street, 3) Opposite the village hall, Chard Street, 4) Holditch, together with the offer of land made for low cost starter homes by Mr B Maber.

The Chief Planning Officer has obtained a 2-3 month deferment on all applications for a thorough investigation and reports.
